



ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT UNIT (EDU) Monthly Report as of December 31, 2025

A. Major Program

In Calendar Year (CY) 2025, the Land Bank of the Philippines engaged the LANDBANK Countryside Development Foundation, Inc. (LCDFI) to conduct the Digital Financial Literacy Training (DxFinLit) under the Agri-Fishery Support through Capability Enhancement for Nationwide Development (ASCEND) program.

As of December 31, 2025, the LANDBANK Countryside Development Foundation, Inc. (LCDFI) has successfully trained a total of 24,045 participants nationwide. This figure represents 120% of the annual target of 20,000 participants for CY 2025.

Out of the total 24,045 participants, the sex-disaggregated data show a relatively balanced distribution:

- Male: 11,338 (47.14%)
- Female: 11,153 (46.38%)
- Did Not Specify: 1,224 (5.09%)

The data reflect near parity in participation between men and women, indicating that both groups were provided equitable access to program activities. This balanced representation demonstrates LCDFI's commitment to non-discriminatory and inclusive service delivery, ensuring that capacity-building interventions are accessible regardless of sex.

In terms of sectoral and vulnerable group representation, the program was also able to reach diverse participants:

- Indigenous Peoples (IP): 2,865
- Senior Citizens: 5,671
- Pregnant Women: 37
- Persons with Disabilities (PWD): 111

The participation of these groups highlights LCDFI's efforts to promote inclusivity and ensure that marginalized and vulnerable sectors are meaningfully engaged in its programs. This further reinforces the organization's commitment to equitable development and social inclusion in countryside communities.

B. Other Support Activities for LANDBANK

LANDBANK's Corporate Affairs Group engaged LCDFI to conduct Digital Financial Literacy Trainings in support of its flagship initiatives.

As of December, a total of 30,718 small farmers and fishers participated—24,045 in training implementations and 6,673 in support activities.

C. Environment, Social, and Governance (ESG) Initiatives

LCDFI upholds its commitment to customer health, safety, and overall well-being by ensuring inclusive and responsive measures in all its activities. During registration, dedicated lanes are provided for senior citizens, persons with disabilities (PWDs), and women with infants or young children to ensure their comfort, safety, and accessibility. In addition, LCDFI coordinates closely with partner Local Government Units (LGUs) and formally requests the presence of medical personnel during activities to address any health-related concerns and emergencies.

As part of its commitment to sustainable development and climate change mitigation, LCDFI integrates environmental awareness into its training programs. The Digital Financial Literacy module includes a dedicated discussion on climate change under the Environmental Risk component. Through this, participants are equipped with knowledge on climate-related risks and adaptive strategies, reinforcing LCDFI's role in promoting environmental responsibility and strengthening the resilience of rural communities.

LCDFI also ensures compliance with the Data Privacy Act of 2012 by informing participants of their data privacy rights. All registration forms include a Data Privacy Notice, ensuring transparency in the collection, use, and protection of personal information. In addition, the LCDFI team allots a dedicated slide during training sessions to discuss participants' data privacy rights, further strengthening awareness and understanding of how their personal data is handled and protected.

In support of Gender and Development (GAD) initiatives, LCDFI actively promotes awareness and empowerment among women. During Women's Month, the organization distributes Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) materials on Women in Agriculture, translated into Tagalog and Bisaya to ensure accessibility and wider reach among beneficiaries.
